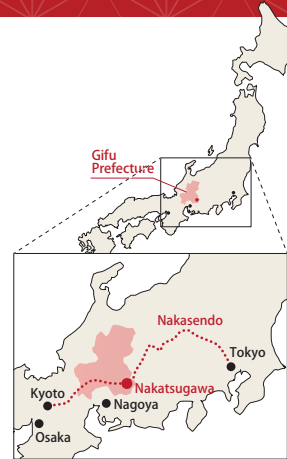
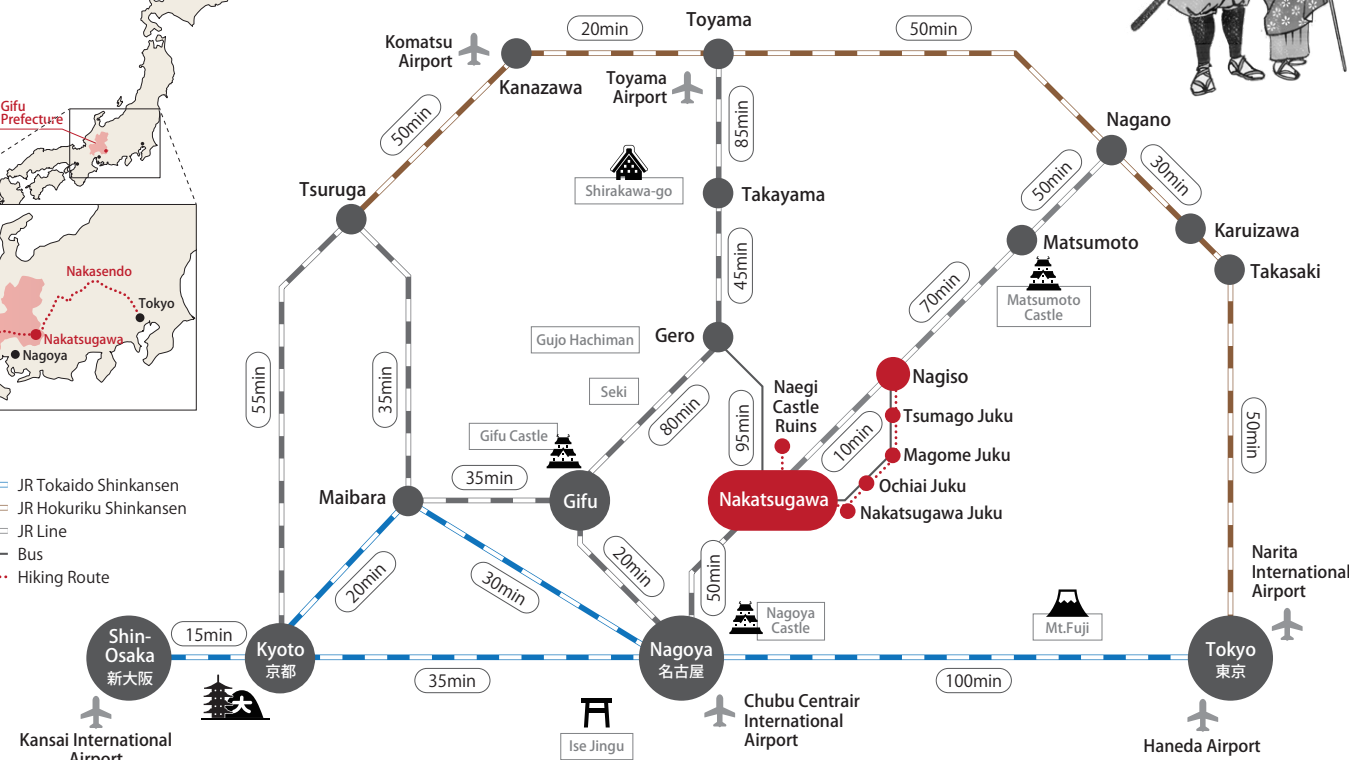


Wide Area Access to Nakatsugawa

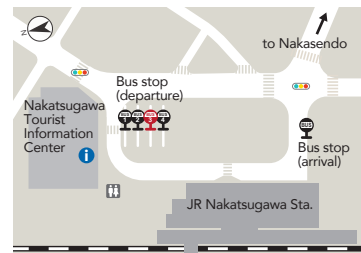
Information around JR Nakatsugawa Station

Bus Information (bound for Magome)

It takes about 25min from JR Nakatsugawa Station to Magome. Bus Terminal at JR Nakatsugawa Station. All the buses from track No.3 go to Magome. There is no direct bus to Tsumago from JR Nakatsugawa Station. To go to Tsumago, change buses at Magome.

Luggage Transportation Service

NLTS (Nakasendo Luggage Transfer Service)

NLTS provides you a luggage transfer service along the Nakasendo trail from your hotel or station to your next destination, such as Magome Inn, Tsumago Inn, Nagiso station or Narai station on the same day or even for a few days. The fare depends on the number of bags and distance. For example, the costs from Nakatsugawa to Magome is 3,000 yen for two bags. Please feel free to inquire.

Nakasendo Tsumago-Magome Hike



One of the most famous walking paths in Japan,
 called the "Samurai Road" in the Kiso Valley.



Feel closer to Japan by walking the Nakasendo trail.

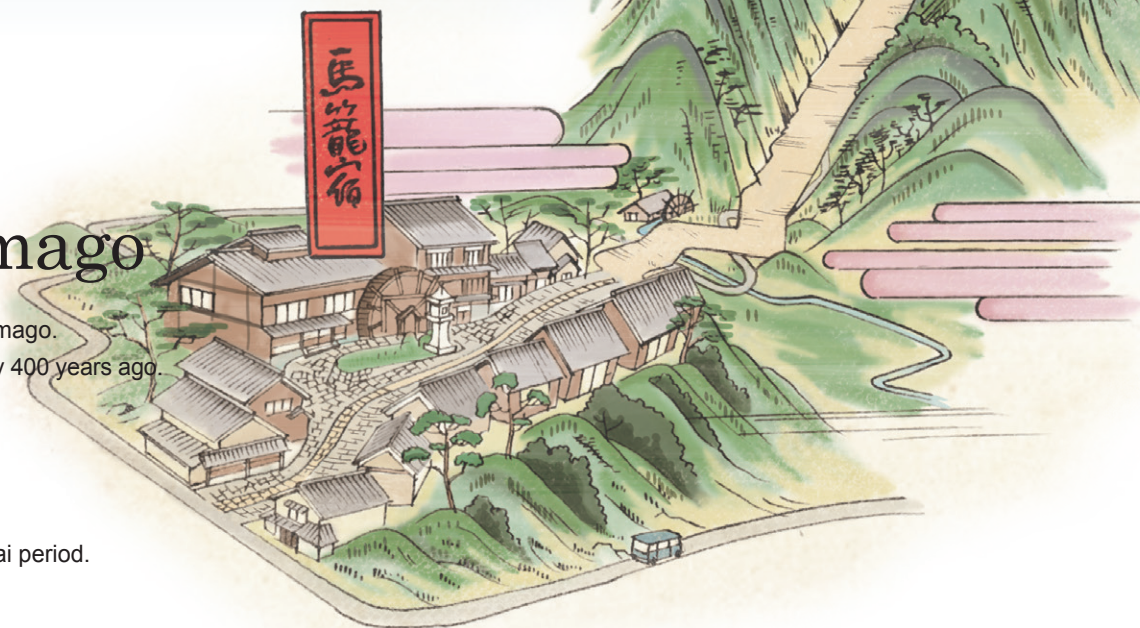
Nakasendo is called the “Samurai Road”, where the Samurai Japanese Warriors walked about 400 years ago. Most of the original walking paths have been lost, but in these areas, some parts of the Nakasendo remain untouched and are known as “Off the beaten track”. The 8km hike between Tsumago and Magome is particularly popular.

Highlight: Trail from Magome to Tsumago

The most popular activity along the Nakasendo Way is the hike from Magome to Tsumago. The Nakasendo Way, also known as the “Samurai Road” was developed approximately 400 years ago. There are 3 small villages between Magome and Tsumago, with several houses, but most of the trail is in forest, with cypress, cedar, bamboo and maple trees. The 8km walk (from the end of the Magome Juku to the start of the Tsumago Juku), which can take 3-4 hours, is great for refreshing from the busy day to day. Whichever direction you walk in, you'll feel you've stepped back in time to the Samurai period.

Tsumago Juku is the post town near to Magome Juku. This is where, in 1976, the “traditional architecture preservation district” commenced in Japan.

In winter, the very soft light of the Waki Honjin filters through the high windows.

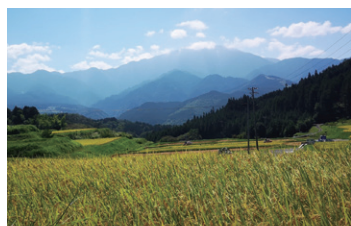
Magome Juku 馬籠宿

MAP D-4

Magome Juku (Juku means post town) is located in the south of the Kiso Valley, with beautiful panoramic views to the west of Japan. Old houses, shops and restaurants are on the both sides of the street.



Watermill is the symbol of Magome Juku, as it locates on the slope. The sharp turn called Masugata makes military march slow down.



Around Magome Juku, there are a lot of rice paddies.

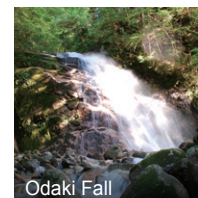

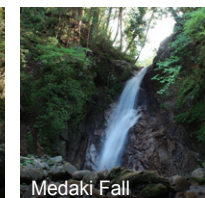
Odaki Medaki Falls 男滝・女滝

Gourmet and Specialties

Oyaki
Oyaki is a dumpling typically found in the Nagano/Shinshu area. As Magome is located on the border of the Gifu and Nagano Prefectures, this town has a mix of food cultures.



Kurikinton

Japanese sweets are well-known in Nakatsugawa City. Especially, the very simple chestnuts cakes are recommended.



Goheimochi

Goheimochi is a local food found in this area. It's made with grilled mashed rice, wrapped with sesame and various nuts. The form differs by area and in Magome it is ball-shaped.

Ochiai Juku

Ochiai Juku is a small post town between Nakatsugawa and Magome. The 44th post town from Edo (Tokyo) has extant Honjin, which basically only people of high standing such as Daimyo (lord) could stay in.

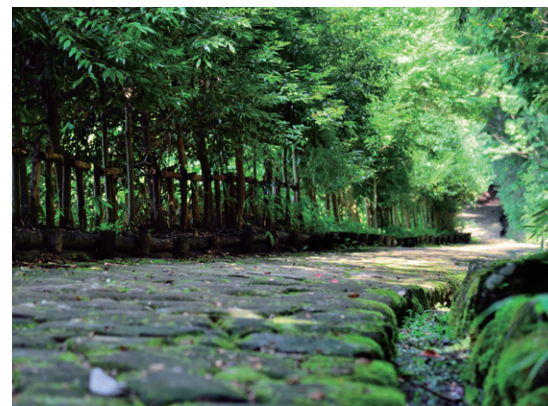

Walking up from Ochiai to Magome, you will pass through Jukkyoku Toge (which means “ten curve pass”). As you can imagine, it is very steep hill up to the Ochiai stone pavement. Once you reach the stone pavement, it has steps, covered by trees with good shade and sunlight through the leaves.

Ochiai Cultural Experience

In Ochiai, there are 3 temples of different sects. Many of Japanese temples played a big role in education during the “the Samurai period”. The culture that people learned in temples, has revived again in Ochiai. English video is available for each program for pre-training.



Zazen

Zenshoji Temple (善照寺)

Zazen, known as Japanese meditation, is a Buddhism experience that will bring you peace in your mind.



Shodo

Koufukuji Temple (高福寺)

Shodo is Japanese calligraphy using special brushes. In this experience, a monk will guide you how to write Japanese characters with the brush.



Sado

Iouji Temple (医王寺)

Sado experience in Iouji Temple includes both serving and drinking in a sophisticated manner developed about 400 years ago.

Nakatsugawa Juku

Nakatsugawa Juku was one of the “Junction” towns, not only during the Samurai period, but from ancient times. So the city with a population of approx. 70,000 is a mix of cultures from different areas. The water to make good Sake is very soft and tasty and is available in the local brewery “Hazama Shuzo”.

Naegi Castle Ruins

MAP A-4

This site is on the steep hill next to the Kiso River and has panoramic 360 degree view which includes Mt. Ena (2191m) and Fujimidai Highland, Kiso River, and some part of Nakasendo.



The huge rocks originally located on this hill are used as a part of stone wall of the castle.



The view of the observatory has 360 degree of beautiful mountains and clear river.

Naegi Toyama Historical Museum (苗木遠山史料館)

Naegi Toyama Historical Museum has a lot of historical materials about Naegi Toyama Clan including Japanese armor and miniature models of the Naegi Castle.

JR Nakatsugawa Sta.

Naegi Castle Ruins

Total : About 1hour / 3.5km (2.17mile)

There used to be a local rail road near the castle ruins. The bridge is still there.

Magome Juku

Hike 9km, about 3-4hours

Tsumago Juku

Hike 3km, about 1hour

JR Nagiso Station.

Total time required for each program changes upon the waiting time for bus and train. The distance between post towns is measured from the Honjin to the Honjin. The distance from the end of Magome Juku and the entrance of Tsumago Juku is about 8km.

Asahigaoka Fushimi Shrine
(旭ヶ丘伏見稲荷神社) MAP B-5



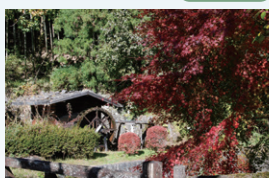
Local shrine kept by local people. Red torii gates are symbolic of Fushimi Shrine.

Ochiai Tanada (small rice terrace)
(落合の棚田) MAP C-4



Surrounding Ochiai Juku, there are steep hills which have small rice terrace.

Watermill
(水車塚) MAP D-4



While you are walking the Nakasendo Way, you always hear the sound of water flowing next to you. Sometimes you see watermills as well.

Gyuto-Kannon
(牛頭観音) MAP E-2



There are a lot of Horse Head Kannon statues along the Nakasendo. It is very rare to see Cattle Head Kannon. In this area, people used cows instead of horses as the hills are steep.

Suwa Shrine
(諏訪神社) MAP D-4



The local shrine near Magome Juku with a holy atmosphere.

Magome View Point
(馬籠ふるさと広場(馬籠見晴台)) MAP D-4



This view point called "Jimba" has panoramic view to the Mt. Ena (2191m) and to the west side to the Nakasendo Way to watch the enemies coming from West Japan.

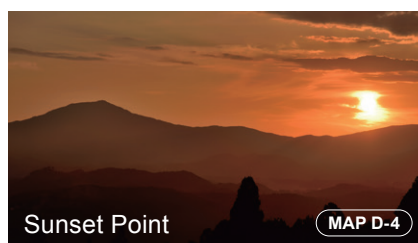
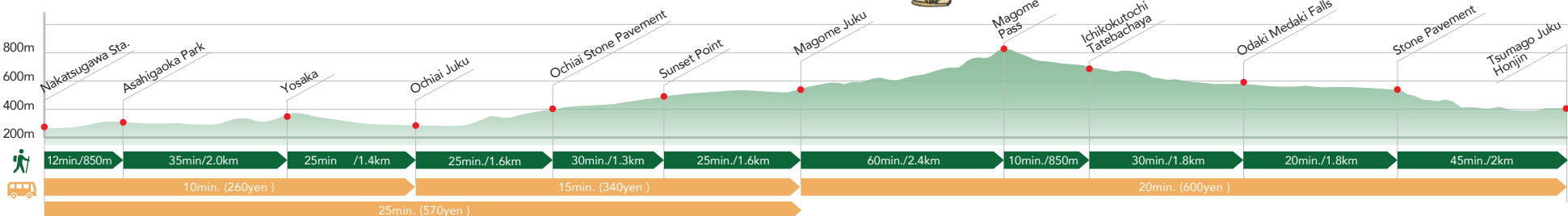
